

High court asks petitioners seeking visas to go to MEA



Ahmedabad: The Gujarat high court on Tuesday refused to ask the Centre to help secure visas for the relatives of nine illegal immigrants who went missing on their journey to the US. The petitioners had requested the court's intervention so that the kin of the missing persons could go looking for them. The court, instead, told them to approach the minister of external affairs.

A PIL filed by the relatives of the nine people who went missing in Feb last year in the Caribbean region. The court had directed the MEA to try and locate the missing persons, but the efforts have not yielded any result yet. During the hearing, the petitioners' counsel requested the bench of Chief Justice Sunita Agarwal and Justice Aniruddha Mayee to ask the central govt informally to help the relatives of the missing persons get visas of the countries in the region so they could go looking for them and bring them back.

The lawyer submitted that their lawyer in the Caribbean region claimed that her boyfriend had spotted 8-9 handcuffed Indians getting out of a police van in Guadeloupe. The CJ remarked the advocate seems to have taken them for

a ride. The petitioners' lawyer insisted on HC's push for securing visas for the relatives, arguing that the places where the nine persons are suspected to have been lodged are tourist destinations and it was difficult to get visas without delay. The lawyer submitted, "Help us getting visas. We will manage on our own."

"To this, the CJ said, "You convince the French government. They will give you visa. We cannot issue such directions. You approach the minister. They will provide all logistical support. That's all. We dispose of this petition with this word," the court said.

It was about to dictate an order, but it found that the original affidavit of the central govt authority was not made available and therefore adjourned the hearing till Feb 14.

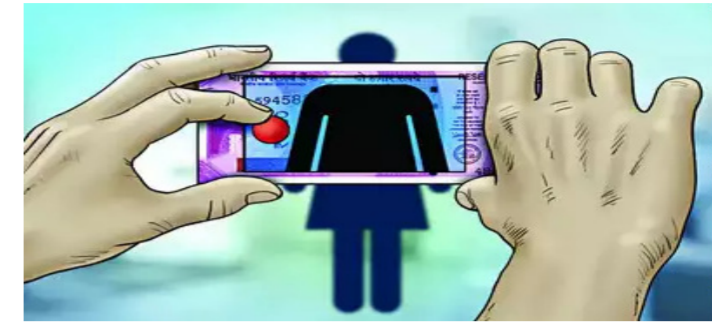

Jilted man circulates woman's nude photos



Ahmedabad: Rejected, dejected, and burning up with jealousy, a 24-year-old man stole objectionable photographs of his love interest and her boyfriend and uploaded them on his social media in Upleta town of Rajkot. The woman Shital got to know about the photos being circulated on social media on February 3. She probed on her own and found that her 'friend' Sunil had stolen them from her phone. She then lodged a complaint with the Upleta police.

Shital and Sunil (both names changed) were friends. While Sunil was in love with her and proposed marriage, she did not reciprocate his feelings as she was in a relationship with another man. In her complaint, she told police that Sunil had been pressuring her to sever her relations with her boyfriend and marry him. However, she refused to do so. Police said that a few days ago, Sunil and Shital casually met and got the possession of her phone for some

time. "He saw some nude photos of her and her boyfriend. He transferred the photos on his phone using Bluetooth so that she wouldn't know," said KK Jadeja, inspector, Upleta.

"To slander her, Sunil posted these photos on his two Facebook accounts 'story', which disappear after 24 hours of posting. However, he blurred the photo of her boyfriend and kept her face visible. Sunil's cousin also uploaded the same set of photos to his Facebook story. Jadeja said the woman believed that her photos had been stolen from WhatsApp Web since she had forgotten to log out of her laptop. "However, Sunil confessed that he took the photos using Bluetooth," he said. Both brothers were arrested and booked for outraging the modesty of a woman and sections of the Information Technology Act.

Two held with 63kg beef in Salabatpura

Surat: Two persons were arrested for selling beef in Rustampura area of the city. The accused identified as Yusuf Shaikh (60) and Madar Qureshi (26), both residents of Limbayat, were remanded to one-day police custody, said officials of Salabatpura police station investigating the case. They also booked three others in the case — Mustafa alias Riyaz Shaikh, Azaz Shaikh and Imam Heera Haji— for supplying the beef to the accused. According to case details, on Feb 4 some cow vigilantes got a tip-off that beef was being sold in one of the meat shops in Rustampura. They informed the police raided the meat shop.

Police seized meat from the shop and sent it for forensic testing. They also detained Yusuf and Madar who were present at the shop. After the FSL report confirmed that the seized meat was beef, police arrested the two accused. In total, police seized 63.5kg of beef. The accused duo was presented before a local court on Monday that granted their one-day remand to the Salabatpura police.

Salabatpura police inspector B R Rabari told TOI, "We have booked five people under IPC 429, 295(A), 114 and relevant sections of Gujarat Animal Preservation (Amendment) Act, 2011 and Gujarat Animal Preservation (Amendment) Act, 2017."

'Fake cop' occupies SMC clerk's house

Ahmedabad: A 55-year-old jobless man faked as an 'encounter specialist cop' with a reputation of eliminating 50-60 criminals to grab the house of a Surat Municipal Corporation (SMC) clerk whom he met and impressed with his brags at a marriage function in Rander in 2020. Irshad Shaikh and his wife Shagufta were booked for cheating and land grabbing by the Athwa police on a complaint lodged by the clerk Abdul Aziz Hakim (55). Hakim had purchased a flat in Keshavkruti Apartment in Athwa in 2019. In 2020, he met Shaikh in a marriage and Shaikh started living there in Nov 2020. Hakim also helped Shaikh with Rs. 75,000 to open a dosa shop as well as treatment of his wife. After a few months, Hakim got to

know from some acquaintances that Shaikh was not a cop. When he asked him to vacate the flat, Shaikh threatened him to frame in criminal cases. He also refused to pay the electricity and tax bills, and maintenance for two years. As he continued to threaten the Hakim and his family, he filed a complaint on Monday with Athwa police which booked him under 406, 420, 114, 506 (1) and under relevant sections of The Gujarat Land Grabbing (Prohibition) Act. Irshad Shaikh and his wife Shagufta were booked for cheating and land grabbing by the Athwa police on a complaint lodged by the clerk Abdul Aziz Hakim (55). Hakim had purchased a flat in Keshavkruti Apartment in Athwa in 2019.

11 days into marriage, woman bludgeons husband to death

Rajkot: The domestic squabbles got so bitter within just 11 days of their marriage that the woman allegedly killed her 33-year-old husband in a village of Bhavnagar district. The woman, Dipika Vasava, is absconding after the crime that was reported from Juna Padar village in Jesar taluka on Sunday night. Dipika, a native of Gavan village in Tapi district's Uchhal taluka, got married to Vaju Gohil on Jan 25 and they started living on his farm in Gavan. On Sunday night, Gohil's brother Pravin, who lived nearby, got a call from his uncle that Dipika had fled after assaulting her husband on the head with some blunt object. When Pravin reached Gohil's house, he was lying profusely bleeding on a bedstead under a tree. Other relatives also reached there and took him to a government hospital in Jesar where doctors declared him dead. Pravin told police that disputes erupted between the husband-wife duo from the first day of marriage over the household work. The fights only worsened. In his complaint with the Jesar police station, Pravin said he strongly suspected that Dipika attacked him over some fight, and his brother died of a severe head injury. Police said they would know more details as to what triggered the fatal assault only after she was arrested. A woman named Gaganpreet, who messaged Bharti on Instagram claiming to be married to her husband Chetan, has been staying at their house and causing fights over their marriage. Bharti has been facing torture from her husband and in-laws even after Gaganpreet left. A woman and her friend attempted to kill the woman's husband in Nashik by strangling him and unleashing a poisonous snake on him. The man survived and is undergoing treatment.

Coaching class owner, engineer among 5 arrested

Rajkot: A pharmacy graduate running online coaching classes for competitive exams, and his engineer friend were among five more people arrested in the racket of providing pre-activated sim cards to cyber criminals and feeding people through fake websites of religious places. The Devbhumi Dwaraka's cyber crime unit arrested Monark Patel (24), a resident of the Bhayli area in Vadodara, Dhansingh Gurjar (26) and Rashid Mev (24), both from Deeg district of Rajasthan and Neeraj Dwivedi (35) and Kaushlendra Varma (32), from Rewa district of Madhya Pradesh. Dwivedi was running online coaching classes along with his friend Varma who has a B.Tech degree. At least 600 sim cards were sent from Vadodara to cyber criminals. To date, the police have arrested 10 people in this racket but the mastermind identified as Nafis is still on the run. In fact, after the arrest of these people, he roped in other people and continued to operate the racket. The cybercrime sleuths dug deeper as the cyber crimes continued with a similar modus operandi even after the arrests. In Dec, police arrested Altaf Sheikh, Hassan Sheikh and Arifbaig Mirza for supplying pre-activated sim cards to Rajasthan-based cyber criminals. Monark Patel was their friend and police found his contact details from the three. Patel who had studied till class 9 has been selling sim cards of various operators for last one year. He came in contact with Dhansingh who started buying these cards from Patel for Rs 400 per sim. Dhansingh used to sell these sim cards to criminals. The probe revealed that Altaf Sheikh, Hassan Sheikh, Arifbaig Mirza and Monark Patel have sent 600 sim cards to the gang of cyber crooks in Rajasthan in the last two years. Ashraf Khan Baloch, police inspector, cyber crime unit, said, "Dwivedi and Varma have made 50 fake websites so far, and many of them were those of Gujarat's tourist places like Dwaraka and Somnath."

300 security personnel deployed: Islamic preacher brought to Junagadh from Mumbai



Ahmedabad: The Islamic preacher, who allegedly delivered a provocative speech at an event in Junagadh on the night of Jan 31, was arrested from Ghatkopar in Mumbai on Monday. Mufti Salman Azhari, who was arrested by the Junagadh police and Gujarat's Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS), was brought to the town amid tight security. Police also arrested two locals - Yousuf Malek and Azim Habib Odedara - who had organized the function at an open ground near the B-division police station. The videos of his speech had gone viral on social media. All three were booked under IPC sections 153B (promoting enmity between different religious groups) and 505 (2) (making statements conducive to public mischief). Talking to TOI, Harshad Mehta, superintendent of police, Junagadh district said, "We arrested Azhari with the help of ATS. Malek and Odedara had organized the function for de-addiction after obtaining permission from the sub-divisional magistrate. We will interrogate the three separately to ascertain the motive of this program." According to Mehta, the police are also investigating why was Azhari invited by the organizers and what was the importance of organizing his speech then.

Heavy police bandobast was deployed in the town before Azhari was brought here with around 300 policemen including three deputy superintendents of police (DSP) and eight police inspectors stationed. Policemen were also deployed in sensitive areas of Junagadh district including Majevdi Gate in the city and some parts of Mangrol. Police said hundreds of Azhari's supporters gathered outside the Ghatkopar police station on Sunday demanding his release when he was first taken there for the arrest procedure.

According to sources, Mufti delivered the same speech in Samakhiali in Kutch district before reaching Junagadh the same day. When contacted, Sagar Bagmar, superintendent of police Kutch (east) said, "We are gathering information if he delivered the provocative speech here. An offence will be lodged once we get the evidence." Mufti Salman Azhari was detained in connection with a hate speech case; the crowd gathered outside the Ghatkopar police station was controlled with additional police force, and there were reports of lathicharge to disperse the mob. Three burglars arrested for breaking into a businessman's bungalow near Olive Beach in Chennai. The suspects were found hiding in Pune and have been remanded in judicial custody. Police recovered 90% of the stolen valuables.

Man changed ID to defraud 34 of 3cr

Rajkot: The Gir Somnath police revealed that a man who was arrested from Ahmedabad for a fraud of Rs 3 crore was using fake identity to commit the crime.

A complaint was registered with Una police station in Dec last year with 34 people alleged Kevin Bhatt and his wife Rupa, residents of Shahibaug in Ahmedabad, had lured the investors with good returns in share markets. Jaydeepgiri Gowsawami, who filed the FIR, alleged that with good returns in share market and usurp Rs 2,92 crore of 34 investors. Bhatt is in judicial custody
